

Habitat: The Satoyama River

Most of the habitats of Giant Salamanders are found in mountainous streams, at around 350m above sea level.

For example, the upstream of Yubara's Tabane River has a width ranging from 3-5 meters of clear water running through houses and fields.

The river bank is full of ideal nesting holes and large rocks for lurking under, as well as lots of broken wood on the riverbed, which helps make an ideal home for the Giant Salamanders.

With moss and sedge growing on large boulders, alongside pussy willow, Japanese sweet flag and wasabi growing on the riverside, it is said to be a safe river close to households.
